The Franklin Institute, The Academy of Natural Sciences, and PNC Grow Up Great collaborate to boost science skills of area preschoolers The PNC Foundation invests in teacher training and family learning activities

PHILADELPHIA, PA, May 7, 2009 - Area preschool teachers will have the opportunity to learn how to teach hands-on science basics in their classrooms thanks to a significant two-year grant to The Franklin Institute and The Academy of Natural Sciences from The PNC Foundation.

The funding supports *Grow Up Great with Science*, PNC's new initiative to help foster a foundation in science for area preschoolers at a time when many educators have sought increased emphasis on the discipline. A study by the National Research Council recognized that providing young children with research-based mathematics and science learning is likely to pay off with increased achievement, literacy and work skills in these critical areas. The PNC Foundation has pledged up to \$6 million in grants to fund regional science centers over three years and conduct an independent evaluation of the program's success.

"The Franklin Institute believes in the importance of early childhood education, particularly in science, and is thrilled to launch the *Grow Up Great With Science* program in collaboration with our longtime partner, PNC Financial Services Group." said Franklin Institute President and CEO Dennis M. Wint. "We look forward to the opportunity to introduce the youngest of children, their families, and their teachers, to the wonders of science through our remarkable hands-on education programs."

The investments made by the PNC Foundation, which receives its principle funding from The PNC Financial Services Group (NYSE: PNC), to The Franklin Institute and The Academy of Natural Sciences were two of 15 grants in seven states and the District of Columbia in celebration of the fifth anniversary of PNC Grow Up Great, the 10-year, \$100 million investment in early childhood education.

"Our support of The Franklin Institute and The Academy of Natural Sciences is another strategic investment to help our non-profit partners, preschools and caregivers develop stronger, smarter and healthier families and communities," said Bill Mills, president of PNC for Philadelphia and Southern New Jersey. The Franklin Institute, The Academy of Natural Sciences and the other grant recipients will use the funding to train local preschool teachers and introduce families of preschool children to science through visits to the centers' interactive exhibits.

In addition, experts from the science centers will travel to classrooms to help teachers create children's activities that will enable them to explore science with their senses and use simple tools to test their ideas. Many of the activities will receive assistance from PNC employees as volunteers. Continued funding is contingent upon successful completion of the prior years' project goals.
