MAYOR NUTTER, AREA STUDENTS, DINOSAURS AND DRAGONS GATHER TO INTRODUCE THE NEW ACADEMY OF NATURAL SCIENCES OF DREXEL UNIVERSITY ON OCTOBER 26

<u>Free Museum Day Features Ceremonial Signing of Historic Affiliation Agreement by</u> <u>Academy and Drexel Presidents</u>

WHAT:

To celebrate the completion of an affiliation agreement establishing the Academy of Natural Sciences of Drexel University, area elementary school students will present Mayor Michael A. Nutter, Academy President and CEO George W. Gephart, Jr. and Drexel University President John A. Fry with hand-made dinosaur and dragon puppets. A highlight of the day for the students will be the countdown and surprise appearance of the Academy's Triceratops mascot and Drexel's "Mario" the Dragon mascot.

To celebrate the completion of the affiliation, Gephart and Fry also will conduct a ceremonial signing of the agreement between the two institutions, and will unveil building signage which invites visitors to enter the newly named Academy of Natural Sciences of Drexel University.

The Academy also will offer the public free admission to the museum for the day, called **Academy/Drexel Affiliation Day**, as a way to kickoff the new partnership.

The historic affiliation promotes learning, discovery, and civic engagement in the natural and environmental sciences, creating an internationally recognized powerhouse in scientific research and education.
