PHILADELPHIA SHELL SHOW AND FESTIVAL AT THE ACADEMY

Saturday and Sunday, October 1 and 2

PHILADELPHIA (September 12, 2011) — The Philadelphia Shell Show and Festival, the largest of its kind in the Northeast, returns to the Academy of Natural Sciences Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 1 and 2.

Thousands of exotic treasures of the sea will be on display and for sale at the annual event, which draws hobbyists, artists and dealers, as well as families who beach-comb "down the shore." The show and festival are free with museum admission and are open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The show features:

- Competitive shell displays by serious collectors and amateur scientists.
- An international market featuring jewelry, exotic shells, shell crafts, books and artwork.
- Classes with woodworker Bill Jordan and artists who make beautifully intricate sailors' valentines.
- Demonstrations by Otolith Sustainable Seafood on shucking oysters and cooking shellfish. The audience gets to sample the seafood!
- Behind-the-scenes tours of the Academy's Malacology Collection of nearly 10 million shells, the world's fourth largest shell collection.
- A workshop with Sanibel Shell Crafters of Florida on creating artwork from shells.
- Walter, the giant Pacific octopus, and Clamzilla, the giant clam. Learn how and why they were collected by the Academy.
- A workshop on the many creative things you can do with the shells you collected this summer.
- Free shells for the kids!
