## Welcome to the Daisy Flower Garden

### Worms are Cool! (page 71)

Head upstairs to *Outside In* and look at the earthworms in the “Look Under” tank. Did you know that earthworms are decomposers? That means that they recycle dead plant material by eating it and returning nutrients to the soil in their poop. Take a close look and see if you can see them wiggle their way through the enclosure!

**Count how many worms you see.**

### Honeybee Dance (page 24)

Do you like to dance? Some dances tell a story. For honeybee workers, dancing tells a story to other worker bees about where to find food. They wiggle their tails and dance in a figure eight to inform other bees exactly where to find the sweet nectar and pollen they need. Look at our bee colony in *Outside In*. Do you see any of the bees doing this dance? Can you dance like a bee?

## Between Earth and Sky

### Desert Habitats (page 67)

Head to Africa/Asia Hall, on the second floor, and find the Desert of Borkou diorama. Can you find any water, such as a pond or a river? How do you think the animals get water in the desert? (Hint, there is a plant related to watermelons in the diorama). Plants and animals in this desert have adaptations to help them survive under the harshest of conditions. Draw one plant and one animal that live in this desert below.

### Drawing Trees (page 15)

Did you notice any trees on the way to our museum? Many people can't believe that trees can grow in the city! Explore North American Hall and draw two different trees that are in our dioramas. Have you seen any of these near where you live?
