This was the first time that both laelvnn and Khadiiah had been on a plane, and the first time out of the country

My experience in Tokyo was one to remember! The reason for our trip was to go to the Science Centre World Summit (SCWS). This was my first experience at a conference. The first day of the conference, we sat in this big room filled with people. They even had these translators that you would use whenever the speech was in Japanese fully. There were a couple of speeches that spoke on a varietu of topics but all pertaining to science. HIH Crown Prince of Japan Nahurito even attended the conference which was an honor. There was a speech from the HRH Princess of Iordan, Sumaya bint El Hassan; she was so pretty and elegant. The other speeches were about architecture and then there was a panel with astronauts lane Davis and Mamoru Mohri who have gone to space together; I found that very cool.

Then we went to the youth panel. We played the well-known WINS M&M icebreaker game. We got to know and learn something about each other. We then spilt into groups and we had three questions we had to answer that basically talked about why it is important to expand your horizons and what can we do to improve


