How to Write a Scientific Label

Labeling of specimens in a museum collection is very important. Labels for our museum collections tell scientists where, when and who found a particular specimen. This Information can help scientists know if an animal is extinct from a particular location in the world or it can tell them that an animal or plant is moving into a habitat that it had not been in previously.
